


PACMAN FROG CERATOPHYRYS



ENCLOSURE BASICS

Pacman frogs are

Minimum tank size for 1 adult Pacman Frog: 20 Gallons

relatively lazy, and therefore do not need a large tank. Their enclosure should be decorated with plants and places to hide. The substrate can be any mix of natural products, such as coco fibers, bark, moss, leaf litter, etc. These are all great options to maintain proper humidity levels and allow for burrowing, as long as the substrate is deep enough. Pacman Frogs also like to occasionally take baths, so a large water bowl is necessary as well.

FEEDING

Pacman frogs have a very diverse diet.

Young frogs will start by eating crickets
and worms. As they grow, they can start to eat small fish
like guppies or feeder goldfish. Pacman frogs can even
start to eat frozen mice as they grow. Young Pacmans
that only eat crickets or worms should eat every day, but
adult Pacman frogs that are eating mice should only be
eating twice per week. make sure that any crickets or
worms being given to your Pacman frog are either being
gut loaded or doused in supplements to ensure your frog
is getting all the essential nutrients.
