# ENCLOSURE BASICS Minimum tank size for

Minimum tank size for 1 Leopard Gecko: 30 gallons

Leopard Geckos love to explore, so the larger the cage, the better! Like most reptiles, leopard geckos are solitary creatures, and do not need to be kept with other lizards.

We do not recommend loose substrate for young leopard geckos, as to avoid eating it accidentally. Instead, we recommend Reptile Carpet, especially for young leopard geckos. If you do chose to use substrate, make sure to supervise your gecko closely or move into a separate tank during feeding times...

# LIGHTING/HEATING

The best way to maintain proper temperature is to use an under-tank heater, as leopard geckos best absorb heat through their stomachs. We also recommend a low wattage heat bulb to allow for a temperature gradient and visibility. A UVB light is recommended, but not necessary as long as proper calcium and D3 supplements are being given.
